Taking Action Together This Engagelive activity aims to highlight the issue of bullying, and tries to encourage thoughts about what bullying is and the forms it takes. It also aims to promote discussion amongst team members about how to combat it. Your pupils are going to be taking on the role of counsellors of the Huntingbridge School ABC (Anti Bullying Club). The session aims to help show that bullies often use fear as a way to avoid being detected, and that by not telling someone when being bullied plays into the bullies' hands. It also identifies that victims often feel isolated when in fact the reality is very different and the bully will have many victims. The activity highlights that talking to a trusted person can stop the victimisation being suffered and prevent others going through the same experience.

The School Trip It is time for Canterbury Way Primary School to go on their Annual Field Trip to Scarborough in the North of England. The staff are slightly worried as there have been some concerns regarding bullying during the year and they do not want the trip to be spoilt by people getting upset because people are being unkind. You have just moved to Canterbury Way Primary School and you are asked if you would like to go on the trip. You have mixed feelings but you want to make new friends so you decide to go. Let's see how you get on?

Diversity & Difference [Click to see sampler](#) This activity was devised for Anti-Bullying Week 2008 with the theme of diversity at the core. The activity once again features the annual school trip of Canterbury Way Primary School, Huntingbridge. Running through the session is the story of Olga, a Polish immigrant who started at the school with no English language skills. The perception by the staff is that she has been accepted by her class and there have been relatively few problems. There are several other topics which come up on the trip designed to make young people think about themselves and their actions. It is hoped that the session is an enjoyable learning experience that can lead to further discussions around these issues.

In addition there will be a number of votes about what action needs to be taken in a number of personal situations.

Transition Aimed at Year 6 pupils who are soon to move on to secondary school who may have concerns about some of the issues involved. Teams take on the role as a teacher as they are introduced to some new situations that they might not be familiar with.
