ROAD SAFETY Click on the red man



Dark Nights! As the clocks go back to mark the end of British Summer Time the evenings become darker. This is an activity which delivers important 'Be Safe, Be Seen' & other road safety messages to students. In this activity students will role play as a road safety officer. As the messages come in students can chat online with experts about what advice they can give to keep the people in the story safe.

Safer Cycling This activity is aimed at reinforcing and supporting the Safer Cycling training that many children will be receiving during the summer term. Students take on the role of members of the Huntingbridge Cycle Club who are running a challenge about cycling for schools. Taking part in this session, students will receive a series of messages about cycling that are apparently comments from young people who are 10 or 11 years of age. They will need to look at these messages and decide how to respond and send a message in return that either recognises the information is correct or telling them it is incorrect and giving supporting information. At any time during the session experts will be monitoring the advice and commenting on it and will answer direct questions.

A Dangerous Road Pupils take on the role of a road collision investigator. The scenario is a collision where 2 people seem to be missing. Can the team find them before it is too late?

FIRE SAFETY

A Fire Investigation Students take on the role of a fire service investigator who is allocated the task of investigating a house fire. Information from the fire crew that attended the scene, the occupants of the house as well as the physical evidence all combine to reveal the cause of the fire in which fortunately no-one was hurt.

GENERAL SAFETY

MISSING An activity encouraging young people to think about the consequences of decisions they make. Every year thousands of children go missing, very often for very short periods. This scenario examines the subject.

SAFETY ZONE This is an activity looking at many dangerous activities that children can get involved in. Role playing as 999 emergency operators they will receive simulated calls and messages which they have to make decisions about. Through examining some of the calls the emergency services received it is hoped that they will think before getting involved in dangerous activities themselves.
